The night when Peter, one of our Movember Men, stepped out of the boat onto a stormy lake, and walked towards Jesus on the surface of the water can be seen two ways. It can be the night he failed and fell, or the night he alone of the twelve disciples

in that fishing boat trusted Jesus enough to walk on water.

I think it's worth remembering Peter's trust and how Jesus kept him afloat. Peter's experience shows that Jesus can be trusted to help us do miraculous things, and also trusted to pick us up when we risk something and fall down.

The Board and I think God is leading us to follow Peter's example in 2011 and beyond.

It's very exciting! We think God is inviting us to step out of the boat, together and individually, to discover

what God wants to teach us by experimenting, by doing; to act on what we have learnt by listening to sermons and reading books.

We sense that 2011 will be an adventure in learning

to trust God by taking small risky steps in God's direction, just like Peter did.

We're in the early stages of figuring out what this means for us in 2011, and we'd love your input. Feel free to borrow a copy of the first chapter of the first
