

Oh, Christchurch. Brooke Fraser sings in her new song 'Flags':

I don't know why the innocents fall While the monsters still stand And our lives blow about Like flags on the land

And we don't know either. Why has a five-month-old baby with his life before him been crushed by a falling ceiling? Why are our screens and newspapers filled with pictures of sand and rubble?

In January at West we spent some time with Habakkuk, who lived in

similarly desperate times, and in June this year we're going to spend a month with Job, an innocent man who lost everything, and whose friends were worse than useless in helping him make sense of tragedy. So I hope that there will be room for all of our questions this year at West, and we can help each other make sense of being human in this fragile world.

In the meantime, there are things we do know. We know that God in Jesus lived, suffered and died alongside us

and understands our tears and confusion. And we know that God in Jesus Christ has opened up hope for us and for Christchurch, that this tragedy is not the last word.

Brooke ends her song of lament with these words:

You who mourn
Will be comforted
You who hunger
Will hunger no more
All the last shall be first

Of this I am sure

You who mourn will be comforted You who hunger will hunger no more All the last shall be first Of this I am sure

You who weep now will laugh again All you lonely be lonely no more Yes, the last will be first Of this I'm sure

I don't know why the innocents fall While the monsters stand I don't know why the little ones thirst But I know the last shall be first

May it be so for Christchurch.

Closer to home, **Kingdom Resources West** provides budgeting help and interest-free loans to people in New Plymouth, and we have a special relationship with **Spotswood Primary School**, across the road and are working on providing a full-time Family Mentor for the school community.

Great news on the **Family Mentor Pilot!** The John Mitchell Trust has given us \$8,000 which means we can begin to look for a person to start part time in the role. We have also begun putting on a special morning tea for the school staff each term; thanks to Robyn R for her beautiful baking this month.

Peter and Leonora are visiting from South Asia where they work with Graeme and Christine T; come and hear about their work on 9 March.

So far six New Plymouth churches have decided to partner with us to expand **Kingdom Resources** across the region. Please pray for Ricky and the team as we prepare for this exciting expansion.
