

Winter can be a good time for some serious thinking (as well as huddling up with hot water bottles).

This year we're taking advantage of the cold weather to warm ourselves by wrestling with some big issues: *Matters of Life and Death*.

From what Prime Minister John Key said recently, it seems likely that the question of legalising euthanasia will come before Parliament in the next term. How can Christians respond to this kind of big question? What do we think and what will we do?

You'll have picked up from the series so far that we're not going for easy, black-and-white answers to complex questions, but looking at the big picture. We

want to cultivate wise thinking and compassionate acting.

It seems to me that matters of life and death that raise

ethical dilemmas come down to people having a sense of community – or not. If a woman feels trapped in a crisis pregnancy or a family is exhausted by caring for an elderly relative, a strong, supportive community is the first port of call.

So this winter, while we wrestle with ethical questions in the face of accelerating technological

advances, let's also keep nurturing our own place of shelter, faith and laughter.

Financial update from the Board: You may remember that we had cash flow problems last year and borrowed \$3,000 from our term deposit to tide us over. We have now paid it all back thanks to the church's steadier offering income this year. Thank you to all who are able to contribute in this way, and thank you to Lynda C our Treasurer, for overseeing this.

We have budgeted for \$7,667 per month in offerings; in June offerings were \$6,114.
