
A special welcome to visitors to West, a place of shelter, faith and laughter. We are an all-age, all-stage community where everyone is included.

Google Maps in the 1800's??? Our National Anthem says "Guide her in the nations' van!" After a quick Google search I learnt this really means "Guide us together as we move forward." In context this means "Guide us together as we move forward in preaching love and truth to all people." Our National Anthem is a treasure! I find it a very moving hymn, especially sung together.

God Defend New Zealand was written in July 1876 by Thomas Bracken. Bracken was a journalist, lyricist and Dunedin Central MP.

Keith Newman shares the following about Bracken: Seven months after the Parihaka invasion, Bracken stood with the Māori MP's of the time to denounce the holding of Te Whiti and Tohu without trial as "a monstrous thing" and a breach of the Treaty. While most politicians supported the actions of Native Minister John Bryce, Bracken, in his maiden speech that day spoke boldly:

"Are we living in a free British colony, or under some petty local despot? Will the people of New Zealand allow any man, even though he hold the rank of Native Minister, to ride roughshod over the constitution... or suspend trial by jury if it so pleases him?"

Thomas Bracken had a colourful career. He had faith in God and was a continual seeker of justice for Māori. Having given up all rights to what would become the nation's anthem, Bracken died in Dunedin hospital in 1898 after being found penniless and extremely ill living behind an old tram shed.

May we sit with these words this month. May we pause to praise God. May we pray for New Zealand. May God guard us from corruption, dissension, envy, hate. May we make peace, and be mighty hosts. May our causes be just and right. May our love for God increase. May God guide us in the nations' van, of preaching truth and love to man(kind).

God of Nations at Thy feet, In the bonds of love we meet, Hear our voices, we entreat, God defend our free land. Guard Pacific's triple star From the shafts of strife and war, Make her praises heard afar, God defend New Zealand.

Men of every creed and race, Gather here before Thy face, Asking Thee to bless this place, God defend our free land. From dissension, envy, hate, And corruption guard our state, Make our country good and great, God defend New Zealand.

Peace, not war, shall be our boast, But, should foes assail our coast, Make us then a mighty host, God defend our free land. Lord of battles in Thy might, Put our enemies to flight, Let our cause be just and right, God defend New Zealand.
