We've been thinking about mentoring; "lovingly walking alongside somebody in their life journey for a while." Here is the 1st XV of mentoring, borrowed & adapted from Carey Baptist College principal Charles Hewlett. These apply to many relationships and situations.

1. Work hard at developing the relationship

Mentoring is all about the relationship. Remember there is no formula, no ideal model, and no programme of steps to success.

2. Maintain regular contact

Develop ways of regularly communicating with the person you are mentoring. Write a note, send an email, a text, or even a phone call! Sit by them at church, etc and let them know they are important to you.

3. Establish Expectations

It might be as simple as saying "we're going to meet once a month for 1 hour, and we'll each bring one thing to talk about."

4. Provide a safe space

When mentee and mentor know the other is for them, when there's trust, and openness, we're providing a safe place to ask questions, to explore topics, to be creative.

5. Listen (cause it's not all about the mentor!)

We need to let the mentee speak and listen to them well and carefully. It is important to listen behind the words, to try and hear what is going on inside the person's heart as well as head.

6. Ask good questions

Mentoring is more about asking good questions than giving good answers. It is very easy for us to answer and to tell someone what to do – but good mentoring resists this.

7. Provide some new information

However, do try and contribute information that might be new. Put time aside in preparation.

8. Encourage theological (God) reflection

Try to encourage people to think with a Kingdom of God mind-set. "Theological reflection occurs when the events of life are examined through the eyes of faith in order to integrate experience and faith."

9. Be transparent

Mentoring is about the sharing of life and experiences, the successes and failures, the good times and the bad. When mentors and mentees open their hearts and minds to one another they make themselves vulnerable - this is the heartbeat of mentoring.

10. Be honest

A mentoring relationship is only worthwhile if we are able to speak the truth to one another. A good mentor will have the ability to lovingly and gently confront.

11. Be creative

Don't always do everything the same – it tends to get a bit boring!.

12. Provide encouragement and hope

Don't hold back on the affirmation. Affirm people's efforts and let them know when they have done well. Often you will see the potential in the people you are mentoring before they do – so tell them.

13. Be an advocate

There will be times when we will be required to support and even speak up for a mentee. It's so important they know we are for them – even when things are hard.

14. Be prepared to learn

The Christian life is a relational life that recognises our common humanity. We journey through life with others, we are equals, partners together in God's mission, co-workers the Bible describes us as.

15. Encourage holistic development

At Carey there is a learning model with four components; knowing (knowledge), doing (skills), being (character) and feeling (empathy & passion.)
