Christmas and the summer season are a great opportunity to begin again. God gave the world a fresh start when He sent Jesus. Knowing Jesus at Christmas gives us the hope of a fresh start no matter what's happened.

The first Sunday of Advent, 27 November is the beginning of a new year the Christian New Year. The Church calendar

begins, not on the 1st of January, but with the first Sunday of Advent which is four Sundays out from Christmas Day. Advent is a Latin word that means "Coming" and the "Coming" we are celebrating is the coming of our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ and the difference He makes in our lives.

So, firstly, this season is a good time to say thank you to people – to show an attitude of gratitude for the year that has passed. So, what should we do? For me I would like to say a big thank you to everyone from West Baptist Church especially to those who have given me a warm welcome and helped me belong to this community. I also want to say 'thank you' to everyone who has volunteered and served at West Baptist Church over this year.

Secondly, this season is not only a good time to count our blessings but it is also a good time to forgive each other because God forgave us. To know Jesus personally and to have our sins forgiven, we must believe that we are sinners separated from

God and that our only hope is in Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, who came and died for our sins. But we must not stop with this realisation. As we welcome Jesus Christ into our life as Lord and Saviour, we also need to take steps towards confessing and turning from our sins. He will move in and help us to change from the inside out. So, who do you need to forgive or to apologise to this Christmas? Who are they? They might be your friends or family or others. What relationships do you need to work on right here and now?

You can invite friends, workmates and neighbours to worship God who is our Saviour, our peace. As the Bible says, if we draw near to Jesus, He will draw close to us.

Which also raises the question, is it you who needs to draw near to God this summer? What's your plan to study the Bible in January 2017? A regular pattern of Bible reading can help this. Is this week a good time to restart or re-evaluate your daily readings?

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing over this season so that you may abound in hope through the power of the Holy Spirit (Rom 15:13).
