Surprise Andrew In the last week of September I spent the week on planned Study leave. I'm participating in a two year programme called the "Arrow Leadership Course." It's such a privilege and help to have study leave/sabbatical time built into my role for my development and wellbeing — I'm deeply appreciative of this.

One of the many things I took away from this week came from a morning chapel time of singing and preaching whilst looking out along the beautiful Long Bay Beach and Regional Park.

As we looked out from this window at the front of the chapel there were a number of guys working for the council, right on the fence line you can see through the window. They were skilfully building a retaining wall and pathway with a digger and by hand – pretty much right in front of us.

Our beautiful view and our quiet peace were very compromised! Not only that but, our worship was in full view of these guys.



Apparently somebody from our group thought they'd take the initiative to offer to ask them to pause for half an hour, or move to a different part of the retaining work.

Our preacher Val Gould responded by suggesting we leave them be, and it turned out she was able to incorporate this situation into her sermon a few minutes later.

Val preached from Nehemiah chapter 3 which is about the numerous different groups of people who contributed to the work of

rebuilding Jerusalem's walls. But it wasn't about the walls! The people believed rebuilding the walls was something that pleased God. They provided security, peace, and more honour as a people group. Their work was worship. They worshipped as they worked together.

Personally, I find it quite easy to worship God in the wonders of his creation. When I walk with Libby to Kindy and see our Taranaki Maunga poking its head out through the houses along Marama Cres. When I drive alongside the Awakino River when heading North. When I run along Back Beach or up the Herekawe Track. When we picnic on Ngāmotu Beach in the warm sun with kids happily enjoying God's playground. When I'm in a beautiful chapel with stunning views along a beach and park area.

How much more so can we worship God in the seeing of each other at their best? Every single person is more than just God's creation – each person is made in God's very image!

When we look at each other – may we worship. Perhaps this means we keep our eyes open in worship – seeing other people. Perhaps we can encourage one another in sharing "I've worshipped because of you____" This makes me think of how we share our benediction with each other, to each other.
