This Sunday is the first Sunday in Lent. Lent is the 40 day (plus Sundays) period of time leading up to Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Lent prepares us for Easter. Lent is a time of reflection on the life and work of Jesus and to consider our own responses to his call to follow him. Sometimes it is a time of fasting and sacrifice. However, this need not be the focus. There is a joyous anticipation with Lent, a joy well described by Roman Catholic priest Thomas Ryan in The Sacred Art of Fasting (quoting via Scot McKnight's book, Fasting, in chapter 10)

"Fasting is one of the ways the servants [of Jesus] keep themselves alert in this future-oriented waiting until the bridegroom returns. To what could you liken their discreet, mysterious joy as they wait? You could say it is like the guiet humming or whistling of a choir member earlier in the day of a concert. It's like a mother and father cleaning the house and making up the beds in anticipation of the kids' coming home at Thanksgiving or Christmas. It's like standing in the airport terminal or train station, waiting for your loved one to appear. It's like a fiancée patiently addressing the wedding invitations: The long-awaited event is not here yet, but it will come, and this is necessary preparation. In each case the energy is upbeat, forward-looking, and marked by the quiet joy of anticipation."

This year at West we're going to be focussing not on self-denial or fasting, but on Jesus' life and work as we build toward Easter. (We will utilise Tranzsend's Prayer & Self-Denial at a later point in the year).

Each Sunday we will light a purple (Lenten) candle, remind ourselves of Jesus' life and teaching, pray prayers, be challenged to act, and have discussion ideas presented. I'm hoping this will be a nurturing time for all in our Sunday services.

However, I really hope this will be a faith deepening time in our own homes. I'd like to encourage each household to make a time each day (e.g. over breakfast or dinner, at bedtime) to use the supplied resources to do the following: - light a candle. - say a sentence to remind ourselves of Jesus' life and teaching. - pray a prayer. - be challenged to act (and report back in your household how that's gone), - and discuss an idea.

May this repetition in learning help us in joyful anticipation of Jesus' life, death, resurrection and call - to be learners of his ways.

Closer to home:

We love and partner with Spotswood Primary **School**, across the road. We're involved with HPP Reading, KickStart Breakfast Club, Pastoral Care, Mother's Day Brunch, Morning Tea for staff at the start of each term, Citizenship Award, and other areas individuals volunteer in. There are many ways you can serve our school community if you're interested.

Spotswood Primary Chaplaincy. Andrew spends Wednesday mornings at the school. He is a part of regular pastoral care team meetings which seek to collaboratively support children and families, and he spends time listening to and supporting children. Andrew is also working on developing a partnership between West, School and Big Brothers Big Sisters mentoring.

Hospital Chapel Service support. Hospital Chapel Service Support: We are gradually having people pull out of the team, because of other changing commitments, and we are now down to only one

additional helper, so lan and Jill would really appreciate having a couple more team members for 2020. It's not an arduous task at all, it is greatly appreciated by patients who desire to attend the services, and we only do it 4 times per year (and you'd not have to help every time.)
