Kia ora West,

Well it's been about seven weeks since life has started to return to a resemblance of normal. For many of us here in Aotearoa, not too much has been affected. Others though are really struggling with job and/or income loss and all that entails. When we consider the relatively excellent position we are in as a country, we can be very grateful for the wise and compassionate decisions made and still being made. Of course, it's very different overseas. There is so much poverty, disease, lack of equipment, lack of character in leadership, confusion and hopelessness. It's not all like this, but it seems there is a lot – and there's no end in sight for some countries who haven't peaked in Covid cases yet. It continues to be an important time to pray for our government and the governments of the world.

Our local government has been up to a whole lot of good too. We are blessed in Aotearoa! This week the NPDC voted to introduce Māori Wards – a way to ensure both Treaty of Waitangi partners have a say in local affairs. There is much more work to do in this area to enable justice to flourish. It is quite possible a citizen-initiated referendum happens with the aim to overturn the council decision. I see that there are four challenges with this. Firstly, that central government needs to change the law that allows Māori ward citizen-initiated binding referendums at a lower threshold to voting on other types of wards is clearly racist – and I use that word carefully and purposefully. Secondly, the 83% of people who voted against having a Māori ward in 2014 (only around 40% of citizens voted) probably only voted that way as they thought it was the most fair way. I suspect there is the challenge to help these people understand the views of the other side and that doing this would quickly shift many of this 83% / 21,000 to vote in favour of a Māori ward. Thirdly, it's now 2020, not 2014. We've all had more time to think and mature in our views about justice, equity and the Treaty. We can think things through and change our minds on topics. Could our citizens vote in favour this time? Fourthly, Andrew Judd suggests that the 'silent majority,' (the huge group of people who didn't vote), could make a big difference. We all have a responsibility to engage with these important topics in our community and country.

A prayer for our leaders:

Jesus, you were born in a little town. You grew up under the leadership of local authorities and officials who made decisions that affected your daily life. You grew up under the dominant power of the Roman Empire that was clearly against what you and your father's work is about. We lift up our local leaders today. We pray for our mayor, councillors, working committees, council staff, and all who serve our city and region. We lift up our central government leaders today too. Strengthen them all with wisdom and grace for the heavy burdens they carry. May they manage their teams and projects with love. Keep their hearts pure and their eyes turned toward your face - and/or the things that matter to you - as they work in the best interests of the people they are called to serve.

In your name, power and grace Lord Jesus, Amen.
