We especially love having kids involved in the service on Sundays. So please don't worry if anyone with you makes a little bit of noise – we're glad to have you with us!



Kia ora West,

The photo here is from October 14th up on the Pouakai Range. It was the school holidays and I took my kids and one of their friends for an adventure. I love our Maunga!

Our Fruit of the Spirit series was planned about a year ago – and it seems like such good timing! I've certainly been encouraged and reminded that living out kindness and gentleness are Jesus–like ways of being – regardless of whether our context is easy or complex.

Our context is like no other that we've previously encountered in respect to this pandemic, especially when we consider factors like social media which provide information at our fingertips and too often enable polarisation and conflict.

It seems like almost all conversations end up on our Covid response. There are significant decisions ahead for many people, including churches. This includes us at West. We need to engage in a process to determine a way forward together. What does a loving Christ-like response look like? There are many aspects to consider.

I believe one topic (of many) we must consider is a Christian response to the question of personal rights, or more specifically religious exemption. For over 1500 years the church has held a place of power in Western society, and with this comes the unfortunate expectation of thinking we don't have to follow all the rules.

A fellow Baptist pastor passed some writing on to me that the following points are based on: What does our faith in Christ Jesus exempt us from?

- Putting my wants above the needs of others. There must be no competition among you, no conceit, but everybody is to be humble: value others over yourselves, each of you thinking of the interests of others before your own. Philippians 2:3+4
- Claiming 'my freedom in Christ' is a reason to act without responsibility. My sisters and brother, you were called to freedom; but be careful, or this freedom will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Rather, serve one another in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: "Love your neighbour as yourself." Galatians 5:14+14
- Refusing to protect the most vulnerable in our midst.
 The truth is, every time you did this for the least of my sisters or brothers, you did it for me. Jesus speaking, in Matthew 25:40

In our attitudes and in our decision making; may we put others before ourselves, may we see our freedom in Christ as opportunity to love others, and may we keep Jesus' vision front and centre – to care for and respect the most vulnerable in our midst.

We're in a real state of change. Whilst we don't know what's around the corner – that is alright. Everything will be O.K. We will get through this. It is well with our souls.

To help us navigate the changing landscape we will be thinking and talking together in the coming weeks and months. In the meantime, here are some important things to know about gathering together on Sunday mornings or other times:

- Please come if you are well. Please don't come if you are unwell.
- Please get vaccinated as soon as you can. Call 0800 28 29 26 or visit here
- Please bring a face mask and pop it on before you leave your car to walk inside.

- Please sign in via Tracer App or write your name down like usual. There will be a 'clean/sanitised group of pens' and a 'used group of pens.'
- Please sanitise your hands in the foyer.
- Regarding use of face masks in faith based gatherings, The Government website says: "When you do not need to wear a face mask: Worship or faith-based gatherings, for example church services " <u>https://covid19.govt.nz/health-and-wellbeing/protect-yourself-and-others-from-covid-19/wear-a-face-covering/</u>

However, we would like everybody to please leave their face mask on during our time together (except morning tea).

- We want to model actions of compassion to others.
- We won't be (and do not need to be) socially distanced as a faith-based gathering.
 - This makes mask wearing more important.
 - In addition, we encourage people to sit in their bubbles
- Some people will be comfortable with an elbow bump, some might not. Please be considerate of others and leave enough space for people to keep their distance if they want to. As always, we'll extend grace.
- If you'd like to physically give a money offering we won't be passing bags around, but we will have a *new wooden offering box* you can put it in at the back of the auditorium either before, during or
 immediately after the service.
- People speaking from the front will remove their mask whilst speaking.
- Morning Tea will be happening, carefully prepared as usual.

Money Offerings on Sunday mornings:

Like many other churches we've decided to stop passing offering bags around as a part of our services. Instead, for people who would like to offer a physical offering (cash or cheque), we have a new wooden offering box. **Thank you lan** for making this – it looks lovely. The offering box will be located on the rear wall each Sunday morning. Please feel free to utilise this as you enter the building, during the service, or immediately after the service (our offering counting people remove cash shortly after we finish.) Often (but not always) we have a reflective space in the service where we can get up, move around and engage with various activities. These spaces (or other times if you'd prefer) could be utilised for giving a physical offering.

Services are about creating a place and space to worship and connect with God together, as well as connect with each other, the world, our neighbours and ourselves. In light of this, our Leadership Board would also like to highlight the opportunity for people who give via internet banking to connect with God by also utilising this offering box. Currently we have a harakeke (flax) woven basket with little written prayers that we can take and read and

place in the offering so as to remember our own offering. We'll be developing this further and hope it will be something meaningful in people's gathered worship.

West Baptist assist regularly at **Spotswood Primary School** in preparing **Breakfast** for the children. We are short of volunteers for Fridays this term – if you think you might like to help, please chat with Carol.

Prayer: If you have a prayer request, please contact Andrew who would be delighted to pray with you and/or put your request on the prayer chain.

We have an **e-mail prayer chain** where a dozen people are committed to praying for any request, as they are able. All West people are encouraged to be a part of this. If you'd like to join the prayer chain as a pray-er, please contact Andrew.

Each month we will keep the church informed of our progress. We have budgeted for \$9,600 per month in offerings; in September our offerings were \$10,370.
