

As we read this newsletter, we'll be in the midst of Easter – somewhere between Maundy Thursday and Resurrection Sunday.

Perhaps this year more than most in recent history, we are conscious of suffering in the world. As my family tuned into the 6 o-clock news on Monday we were inundated with images of immense suffering of innocent people in Ukraine. Following this was information about the widening of the Royal Commission of Inquiry into the abuse of children throughout all New Zealand churches. There has been and continues to be so much suffering.

Good Friday has a crucial message for the world about suffering. Here are a couple of paragraphs Richard Rohr wrote this month on the topic.

In Matthew'17:1-19, we read of the wonderful story about Jesus' Transfiguration. In this story "Jesus is preparing" his disciples for the cross—it's going to come, so be ready, he seems to say. Jesus knows it's the only thing that's going to transfigure them, and the same thing goes for us, too. You see, suffering has this strange and marvellous ability to pull us into oneness. Maybe you've seen it happen in your family, at the funeral of a loved one or some other communal tragedy. I think many of us felt it in the early days of the pandemic—before our dualistic politics got in the way—there was a sense that we were in it together.

Until we find the communal meaning and significance of the suffering of all life, we will continue to retreat into our individual, small worlds in our misguided guest for personal safety and sanity. A Crucified God is the dramatic symbol of the one suffering that God fully enters into with us—not just for us, as we were mostly taught to think, but in solidarity with us. The Good News is we do not have to hold that suffering alone. In fact, we cannot hold it alone.

As we approach Easter, let us remember that we too can follow this path, actively joining God's loving solidarity with all. What starts in God ends in God. All of reality is moving toward resurrection. This is the great hope of our tradition and one that is becoming more and more necessary for the world to hear."

God knows the messiness of being human. God came and embraced and loved despite this. God is in solidarity with those who are suffering. God is making all things come alive into newness!
