Kia Ora whānau,

On Sunday mornings we're in the midst of a series on Being Church. We're wrestling with what it means and looks like to be committed to God and to one another as a part of West Baptist Community Church. Here is some of the content I've shared so far, hopefully to serve as a reminder and prompt for subsequent discussions about us replacing membership with covenant partnerships.

- When it comes to thinking about us and God, individualism suggests our relationship with God is something that we, by our faithfulness towards God, are responsible for accomplishing and sustaining. And worse, that our efforts in relating to God are independent from the faithfulness of God and others towards us.

- The danger is that we forget and neglect that it is not our response to God that brings love and life - but God's initiating love for all humanity.

- We can think of being church as having a vertical dimension – God and the gathered community. And a horizontal dimension, between people.

- "God's love enfolds us <u>not</u> because of us keeping a contract." Rather, God wants a relationship based on covenant.

- A covenant is a personal relationship established at God's gracious initiative. It's God started and isn't dependant on us being good enough.

- God's love enfolds us because of God's nature and initiating Covenant. Jeremiah chapter 31 verse 33 "I will be their God, and they will be my people."

- Parents are totally committed to be their child's mother or father and love them no matter what – irrespective of their behaviour. In effect parents declare to children: "we will be your parents, and you will be our child." The first part of this is saying "This is the kind of person I promise to be to you: I will love you, and care for you and be there for you no matter what." And when we say "And you will be my child" we're also saying we expect their behaviour towards us to correspond to our covenantal love towards them. So that... we all find joy in participating in this love together. But always covenantal love, never as a behaviour contract.

- When we come to thinking about covenantal partnerships with God and each other – as opposed to membership, a couple of important features are: to be wary of describing what our relationship with God needs to look like – what we need to believe and do. This puts too much weight on our descriptions of efforts to be good. Let the emphasis be on embracing our true identity as being enfolded in God's loving kindness, and responding to this initiative of God in ways God leads. Perhaps the emphasis should be on the direction we are walking... if it's towards Christ – great! That's enough. And of course, this initiating love of God flows into our horizontal relationships with each other

- "On the way and in the fray." We are on the way – on the messy journey – together with and towards Jesus Christ. And as our draft covenant partnership wording states; "in both ways known and yet to be made known." We don't have certainty about life, about God, about what being a faithful disciple of Jesus looks like – in relationship with both God and each other – but as we walk together "on the way" towards the risen Christ, we trust that we will be led in the ways of God.

- Being a part of a church family with each other means we are to be radically committed to one another in costly, self-giving, messy, covenant love.

- We can disagree and get along – united by the most important things – and extending grace on less important things. We can love people but sometimes we might not like them. We can't choose our spiritual family – so we choose our friends. This is very counter-culture. It's very challenging and difficult. And I think it also brings great depth and meaning to our lives. It's a big commitment to covenant together to "watch over one another with love" like how we're suggesting in our draft covenant partnership statements.
