Ténā koutou e te whānau a te Karaiti,

February has been quite the month. For us in our local West community, we have had very challenging times facing great sickness, struggles, and loss of loved ones. It has been difficult hearing stories of loss for many of those in our community. On top of this, we've also seen many of our neighbours across Te Ika-a-Māui devastated by cyclone Gabrielle. Furthermore, the world has mourned the huge loss of life at the hands of earthquakes in Tűrkiye. And yet still we watch on as war continues to rage on in Ukraine. It seems that every day has new stories for us to mourn. I find that it can be very hard to find hope and joy in moments such as these.

However I am reminded of some of the insights of Matthew that we have been

exploring over the last month or so. I am reminded of the suffering, incarnate God who put on flesh and joined us in our pain. In times such as this I am reminded that God is not distanced from us, but joins us in our world's pain and suffering. When we are faced with challenging and trying times, Jesus is a message of hope for all people. When faced with death, Jesus overcame and brought new life.

As we learned last Sunday, our God is a God that suffers alongside the oppressed and confronts those with the power over others. Through Jesus' upside-down Kingdom, He has a plan to reconcile all things to himself. And so, as we watch on at the great distress in the world we are invited to intercede, to be generous, and compassionate to those that we can reach as we participate in this upside-down Kingdom of love.

The Gospel of Matthew closes itself with this timely reminder for us all – "And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b.)

Matthew Series:

It has been such a blessing to have the space to explore the gospel of Matthew together over the past six weeks. I have been grateful for the opportunity that the church has given me to spend time meditating on scripture, and seeking lots of input from others on this gospel. This time has brought many new learnings for me, and often I have ended the week feeling challenged by the new learnings of what it means to participate in Jesus' upsidedown Kingdom of grace and compassion.

Jesus has a funny way of seeing through the facades that can sub-consciously be put up, and reach to those niggly areas in life that we don't always want to face or deal with. I have thoroughly enjoyed chatting with various people about their own reflections on the passages, and have often been challenged by your new points-of-view.

However, with hindsight, I think a gospel needs more than six weeks. There is so much I wish I could have shared on Sundays, but it can be tricky to fit everything into a fifteen-minute slot. Thankfully, none of it is wasted learning, and I am sure it will come back in future times.

So, as we wind up this series, I finish feeling very convicted by what the Spirit has been saying throughout these weeks to me and to the West community.
